ROOM 550 CLASS PROCEDURES



"The 5 Ps"-The choices you make will result in either a negative or a positive consequence.

Rule 1: Prompt: Be on time, enter the classroom quietly, take out assignments, check the board for the work, and immediately go to your assigned seat.

Rule 5: Patient: Wait respectfully and calmly for your turn, do not complain. Listen, stay seated and track the speaker when someone is talking.

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LATE / INCOMPLETE WORK



- ☐ The importance of students completing assignments cannot be over stressed which will lead to mastery of concepts. The class assignments which will be due at the end of the period on Tuesday & Thursday unless otherwise stated. Study problems will be assigned so they can practice their math skills. Students will be expected to watch videos and take notes on their own occasionally.
- □ At the beginning of class I will walk around and place a date stamp on assignment page when a student's completes an assignment the day it's due. Stamp + completed assignment = 100%, completed assignment – stamp = something less, and no assignment and no stamp = really bad things happen (NO POINTS).

ABSENTEE POLICY

- * It is the student's responsibility to check the class back whiteboard to find any assignments missed.
- * A student has two extra days to turn in any work assigned on a day a student was absent. If a quiz/test was administered on a day a student was absent, the quiz must be made up on the first day the student returns. If previously assigned work was due on the day of the absence, the work is due on the first day the student returns.

CLASS INFORMATION



<u>CLASSROOM INSTRUCTIONS AND GROUP WORK</u>: Students will work in collaborative groups on a regular basis and approach problems conceptually. The only way students will master the concepts is by being actively involved in their learning. I will be responsible for guiding, supporting and summarizing at all.

<u>CHECKING FOR UNDERSTANDING</u>, Assignments for checking for understanding can be, but not limited to, white-boards problems, exit slips, quick writes, pair share, quizzes and interactive online activities. These will be given according to the teacher's judgment (daily/weekly). Most of these procedures are done during class. These are for the students to show mastery of the material.

<u>TEACHER WEBSITE</u>: This website is available on LHS Website and contains math recourses. Students will be expected to check for missing notes and assignment and download them if they were absent. This will ensure students do not fall behind in class.

<u>TEACHER HELP:</u> I will be available every morning except Wednesdays at 7am and after school on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3pm-4pm.
